WORTH PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

It's been a wonderful summer in the parish, with a number of highly successful events taking place. And as a very welcome bonus, the weather was pretty kind on the whole. Now we look forward to a new season for all of us in Crawley Down and Copthorne. We'd like to say congratulations to everyone involved with the Gig on the Green in July (where the rain did sadly make an appearance) and the Crawley Down Village Fayre in September. Both of these occasions, along with several other smaller events in the parish, were highly enjoyable and extremely well supported.

On a more sombre note, anti-social behaviour can be extremely upsetting for all of us, so it's important to know how to report it. Sussex Police operates a user-friendly web page (details below) that makes reporting as easy as can be, and we encourage all our local residents to use it as and when necessary. By building up an accurate picture of potential hotspots, the authorities can then respond in an appropriate manner.

SAFER STREETS

An important message from Sussex Alerts: Help us to tackle anti social behaviour. We are actively patrolling hotspot areas, but we need your eyes and ears. If you witness anti-social behaviour you can report it here: <https://www.sussex.police.uk/ro/report/asb/asb-v3/report-antisocial-behaviour/>

Reports help us to target areas and discourage behaviour that makes communities feel unsafe. By reporting issues as and when they occur, you'll be helping the Police to build a greater understanding of potential hot spots, and this can then assist with allocating resources in the future. Remember: posting details of an incident on Facebook or other social media platform is not the same as reporting via the correct channels.

COPTHORNE RECREATION GROUND REJUVENATION PROJECT

We are currently still awaiting the outcome of two Section 106 applications for money allocated by local developers for formal sports. If successful, there will be a further £150,000 required to fully fund the project, but there are actions planned to help close that gap. We're carrying out work behind the scenes to get ready to apply for a Public Works Loan and to go out to local businesses for their support with donations or sponsoring particular items, from playground equipment to litterbins, benches, cycle racks and more. LOCAL GOVERNMENT REVIEW

The Local Government Review which will see Mid Sussex District Council and West Sussex County Council merged into one new unitary authority is currently underway. As part of this process, Worth Parish Council is actively engaging with the review to understand what any proposed changes could mean for the community. The Council is currently gathering information, considering the potential impacts and working to ensure the voices of local residents are represented. Once clearer details are available, Worth Parish Council will share updates with the community to keep everyone informed and involved in the process.

SPEEDING WITHIN THE VILLAGE

The Copthorne Village Community Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as one hour every two or three weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would be welcomed. They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 Parish Councils and 15 Wardens carrying out Community Speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

Interestingly, Community Speedwatch compiled a report of their findings between April and June this year. They ran 12 sessions during this period and recorded more than 70 vehicles travelling over the speed limit. This resulted in 63 letters being issued by the Police. Hopefully the motorists concerned will be driving more sensibly from now on.
