These include the Copthorne Recreation Ground Rejuvenation, the Bowers Place Parking Solution, CCTV installations in both villages and the Crawley Down Play Area Improvements. COPTHORNE RECREATION GROUND REJUVENATION PROJECT

Last year we submitted two applications for formal sports Section 106 money (developer contributions) towards this project, as there are no S106 monies available for play spaces in this area. One of our applications for £88,880 was rejected, however, we are thrilled to announce that we were successful for the other application for £199,743.30 towards things like the carpark, drainage and pathways.

Unfortunately, at the time of writing we are still awaiting the outcome of our application for a Public Works Loan for £150,000. We have also now submitted a further application for a National Lottery Awards for All Grant, for close to £20,000 towards playground equipment. CROSSING PATROL AT BROOKHILL ROAD

As many of you will already know, West Sussex County Council recently appointed a new School Crossing Patrol Officer to enable children, parents and other pedestrians to cross this busy road safely in the mornings and afternoons. We would like to remind all motorists of the need to drive slowly and carefully, especially at these times, and to be aware of the need to stop when there are people crossing. In other words, please respect the lollipop!

MAYORAL AUTHORITY FOR SUSSEX

Sussex is undergoing significant changes as part of the Local Government Reorganisation. The current two-tier local government structure is being dismantled. District and borough councils like Mid Sussex District Council and West Sussex County Council are working toward creating one or more unitary authorities. These authorities are expected to replace the current district and county councils by April 2028, with elections for them likely to take place in May 2027.

In the meantime, West Sussex County Council has requested to postpone its May 2026 elections, though at the time of writing this, it is still awaiting approval. Mid Sussex District Council has not announced any plans to delay its elections, so these are currently expected to go ahead in May 2026.

Worth Parish Council elections remain unaffected by these changes. Our next elections will take place as planned in 2027, ensuring continuity for local representation.

BUSINESS PLAN

Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond to our recent survey on the Business Plan. The Plan was due to be adopted at our meeting on 19th January – please check our website to see the final version. The Plan sets out the priorities for the Council, which are CCTV, Bowers Place Parking Solution, Copthorne Recreation Ground Rejuvenation Project and the Crawley Down Play Area

Improvements. It also shows what we will be working on after these schemes are delivered – effective street lighting with a reduced carbon footprint, expanding the youth provision, establishing a war memorial in Copthorne, opening up Copthorne Brook, finding a solution for the Royal Oak Pub, and improving the village centre in Crawley Down.

PLANNING

The Planning & Highways Committee has had a few large planning applications to consider for Copthorne recently. We'd always recommend that if you feel strongly about a planning application, that you ensure you submit your views to Mid Sussex District Council, attend our meetings and contact your local councillors to make your views known. Whilst Worth Parish Council is not the authority responsible for making decisions on planning, we are able to represent the views and concerns of the community to MSDC, who are the local Planning Authority. As always, the earlier we are informed of concerns and issues, the more chance we have of exerting influence.

CCTV

We have been reviewing Phase 1 of our CCTV project, with information from the Copthorne installation on the Village Green being used to help inform future decisions about any further phases of the project in the Parish. It is intended that the Phase 1 review will have been discussed by our Finance & General Purposes Committee on 12th January, with decisions about future phases made in February.

SPEEDING WITHIN THE VILLAGE

The Copthorne Village Community Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as one hour every two or three weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would be welcomed. They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 Parish Councils and 15 Wardens carrying out Community Speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

If you witness speeding in and around the village, you can report it via Operation Crackdown at operationcrackdown.org

SAFER STREETS

An important message from Sussex Alerts: Help us to tackle anti-social behaviour.

We are actively patrolling hotspot areas, but we need your eyes and ears. If you witness anti-social behaviour you can report it here: <https://www.sussex.police.uk/ro/report/asb/asb-v3/report-antisocial-behaviour/>

Reports help us to target areas and discourage behaviour that makes communities feel unsafe.

By reporting issues as and when they occur, you'll be helping the Police to build a greater understanding of potential hot spots, and this can then assist with allocating resources in the future. Remember: posting details of an incident on Facebook or other social media platform is not the same as reporting via the correct channels.

For Years 5 and up. They are completely FREE!

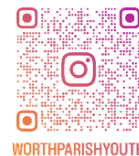
