WORTH PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

By building up an accurate picture of potential hotspots, the authorities can then respond in an appropriate manner.

SAFER STREETS

An important message from Sussex Alerts: Help us to tackle anti social behaviour.

We are actively patrolling hotspot areas, but we need your eyes and ears. If you witness anti-social behaviour you can report it here: <https://www.sussex.police.uk/ro/report/asb/asb-v3/report-antisocial-behaviour/>

Reports help us to target areas and discourage behaviour that makes communities feel unsafe.

By reporting issues as and when they occur, you'll be helping the Police to build a greater understanding of potential hot spots, and this can then assist with allocating resources in the future. Remember: posting details of an incident on Facebook or other social media platform is not the same as reporting via the correct channels.

COUNCIL DROP-IN SESSIONS

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REVIEW

The Local Government Review which will see Mid Sussex District Council and West Sussex County Council merged into one new unitary authority is currently underway. As part of this process, Worth Parish Council is actively engaging with the review to understand what any proposed changes could mean for the community. The Council is currently gathering information, considering the potential impacts and working to ensure the voices of local residents are represented. Once clearer details are available, Worth Parish Council will share updates with the community to keep everyone informed and involved in the process.

ROYAL OAK

Members of the Crawley Down Working Party have met with the landowner of the Royal Oak three times in this past year to discuss the building and find out what plans there are to improve it. The building is in a poor state of repair and in a prominent position on Station Road, so local councillors are keen to ensure the building is made safe and brought back into use. The landowner intends to bring forward a planning application for the site which is likely to include flats on the first floor with a community space on the ground floor, and a retail unit at the rear of the site. The landowner was encouraged to do early community engagement on any plans so that local residents can have their say. The full notes of this meeting were published with the agenda for the Planning & Highways Committee meeting on 1st September.

PLANNING

The Planning & Highways Committee has had a few large planning applications to consider for Crawley Down recently. We'd always recommend that if you feel strongly about a planning application, that you ensure that you submit your views to Mid Sussex District Council, attend our meetings and contact your local councillors to make your views known. Whilst Worth Parish Council is not the authority responsible for making decisions on planning, we are able to represent the views and concerns of the community to Mid Sussex District Council, who are the local Planning Authority. Land north of Burleigh Lane is of significant local interest, so residents may be interested to know that the Committee has met with the developer and the officer at MSDC to highlight the concerns of the community. As always, the earlier we are informed of concerns and issues, the more chance we have of exerting influence.

SPEEDING IN THE VILLAGE

Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as one hour every two or three weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would of course be welcomed. They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 Parish Councils and 15 Wardens carrying out Community Speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

BOWERS PLACE CAR PARKING

As part of our plans to improve the village, we are intending to create 18 new parking spaces on Bowers Place, east of the Village Green. This is a project that has been ongoing for several years, so you have most likely seen details before. Following ongoing discussions with West Sussex County Council about the technical details of our proposal, we have made some necessary changes and are now reapplying for planning permission. These spaces will be available for all public parking and will

not be subject to parking restrictions. The parking spaces will be created by converting the existing verge and path into parking spaces, enabling vehicles to park off the highway and providing a clear carriageway through to the Health Centre. We will update the community once the planning application is live, so that you can have your say on the plans.

DEFIBRILATOR

The defibrillator at Crawley Down shops fell into disrepair several months ago. We have been trying to find a compatible battery to fix it, but that has not been possible. We now know that the machine cannot be fixed and so we have applied for funding for a new machine, and we should hear back about the funding in the next month or two. If funding is refused, the Council has already agreed that a new machine can be purchased and this will be done.

ALLOTMENTS

Worth Parish Council still has a handful of available allotments in Crawley Down, just off Station Road. If you're interested in renting one, please contact us on 01342 713 407 or via email at astclerk@worth-pc.gov.uk. Plots in various sizes are available.

We welcome organised visits to the view the allotments, but we politely request that we are notified of such visits in advance.
