The Crawley Down Working Party would also like to **extend our gratitude to the CDRA** and volunteers who work endlessly to give our village events such as The Gig on the Green and the Village Fayre. Worth Parish Council were able to support both events by offering a grant as well as organising a community litter pick after The Gig on The Green helping in the speedy return of the green to its usual state.

As the clocks go back and autumn light becomes a little gloomier, the village should see some new colour through the introduction of some **new planters**. Positioned by the shops and war memorial, the plan is to add some cheer to lighten up our village centre. We are also negotiating with the owners of some of the properties opposite the Royal Oak to try to make their frontages more welcoming and at the same time updating the notice boards. We are aware that many residents have concerns about the deteriorating state of the **Royal Oak pub** building. We share those worries and are exploring possible options to deal with the problems. The Parish Council does not own the property and so has limited powers to act.

Earlier this year Worth Parish Council raised concerns about some families in the village living in flats that were suffering from **damp and mould**. We complained both to Mid Sussex District Council and Clarion Homes. We do not think it is acceptable that residents in our village should be living with these problems. We are sorry to hear that the problems are continuing and will be asking again for action to be taken.
