# Technical Information

Area inside fenceline: 750m<sup>2</sup>  
Total surfaced area: 767m<sup>2</sup>

150mm mowing strip on all surfacing that joins grass

Large, simple wetpour graphics provide harder wearing surface and add visual interest, whilst minimising joint separation issues

We used timber on the balance trail to add to a softer visual palette

All timber items have steel feel

Seating area and tree planting proposed to provide shade

Permeable pathway has full PCC edge

Large 2m trampoline is more space-efficient than two separates

PPC Edge along southern boundary for ease of install for future pathway

Sensory path has full block edge to retain each section and provide a durable finish

0.2m high mound for wheelchair access

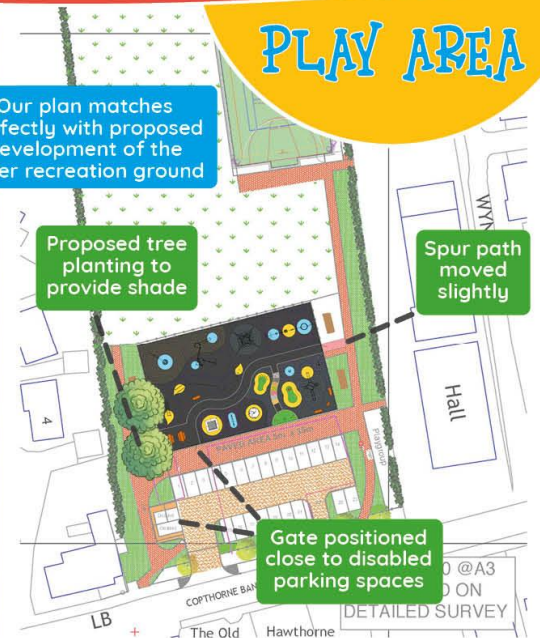
# COPTHORNE RECREATION GROUND

## PLAY AREA

Our plan matches perfectly with proposed development of the wider recreation ground

Proposed tree planting to provide shade

Spur path moved slightly



Mounds are plateaued with flat green artificial grass tops. From experience we find that artificial grass wears very badly on mound slopes

Chainsaw sculptures mounted on steel rods to avoid having any timber in the ground
