Worth Parish Council Quarterly Update January - March 2025

Key Decisions Made

Recruitment for a new Youth Supervisor

Both Neighbourhood Plans have been reviewed and recommended, and resident surveys have been agreed

The following grants have been awarded:

Grant of £450 has been awarded to 4Sight Vision Support

Grant of £450 has been awarded to Air Ambulance Charity Kent, Surrey and Sussex

Grant of £5,000 from Crawley Down Working Party has been awarded to the Haven Centre

We are going to apply for Operation Watershed funding to alleviate flooding at King George's Field, Copthorne

Key Activities

Our Grounds Maintenance Team has been working hard on a number of repair and refurb projects in both Copthorne and Crawley Down throughout the winter

Youth Clubs continue to run each week in both villages, and we are continuing to offer additional youth workshops and activities during school holidays

Copthorne Community Clean Up group has seen a good uptake and we have had many volunteers come along to the village litter picks. We also run volunteer litter picks in Crawley Down. Next pick in Copthorne is on April 27th at 09:30

We are still looking for litter pick co-ordinators in both Copthorne and Crawley Down and for renters for our allotment plots in Crawley Down

Full Council continues to meet regularly to discuss issues important to both villages. The Planning & Highways Committee meets once a month to discuss and comment on local planning applications

Update on Projects

Copthorne Recreation Ground Rejuvenation – we commissioned a drainage design report and are in consultations with playground and MUGA equipment suppliers

CCTV – we have now published our CCTV Policy and Frequently Asked Questions, and have entered into an Information Sharing Agreement with Sussex Police, who will monitor the CCTV on the Council's behalf
