RIPERIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

Did you know that you are responsible for any water course that runs on or under your land? If adjacent to your land, you own up to the middle. A water course can be a stream or a river, or it might just be a ditch or culvert. You need to ensure that the water is free flowing and not blocked be any debris, and you should be careful that any chemicals that you use in your garden do not wash into and pollute the water.

The Parish Council has been working with WSCC, MSDC and the Environment Agency to provide flood modelling of the stream as it runn through the

COPTHORNE INSIGHT WORKING GROUP - YOUR VOICE IN THE VILLAGE

Welcome to this, our inaugural newsletter article. The Copthorne Insight Working Group (CIWG is currently made up of five elected

Copthorne members of Worth Parish Council (WPC). We do invite residents to join the group, but as yet we do not have any non-Council

members. The group discusses the aims and aspirations for improving Copthorne village (there is a separate group looking at Crawley Down), reporting any findings and recommendations back to WPC. Our aim, together with local residents, is to improve the overall village experience and make Copthorne a safer and better place for us all to live and enjoy.

Over the coming months we will be working to tackle some of the issues residents find frustrating (even annoying!) and also look at Some residents have highlighted that the current state of streetlight repairs falls short of the expected standard, particularly where streetlights have fallen into disrepair or are inoperative. CIWG have agreed to investigate this and report back to the Parish Council.

Some background to this topic. The streetlights in Copthorne are currently managed by two separate entities. The older "inner" village residential areas are the responsibility of WPC whereas those on the outer (more recently developed) perimeter are the responsibility of West Sussex County Council. No matter who is ultimately responsible, the respective councils have a duty to ensure that street lighting is in full working order and meets the need for which they are intended.

Over the coming weeks each of the Parish Council streetlights around the village will be fitted with a label comprising a QR code and a unique Location ID. Using a smartphone to scan the QR code, residents will automatically be directed to a website where the location ID can be entered and faults reported. We rely on residents to provide this feedback as, by nature of the fact that streetlights only come on outside normal working hours, Parish Council staff cannot monitor their operation.

Some projects can be implemented quickly by CIWG, others will require collaboration with outside agencies such as MSDC, WSCC etc and possibly require the approval of funding. Consequently, these will take a little longer to implement, so please bear with us.

If you have comments or suggestions you think worthy of discussion then we encourage all residents to contact any of the below WPC members. Also, once the COVID situation has subsided, we welcome villagers to volunteer and work alongside us on CIWG to help us develop and implement a common vision for a safer and more enjoyable place for us all to live.
