CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

As the nights close in we start to prepare for a winter that is going to be a difficult one this year with the rising cost of living and especially energy costs. We need to ensure that our residents do not suffer because of this and to that end we are looking into setting up 'warm hubs' in both villages where people can go to meet and keep warm whenever needed. We will disseminate details of these as we make arrangements, but I trust we will all endeavour to look after each other throughout the cold months.

The Community Governance Review (CGR) by Mid Sussex District Council has now concluded with the resolution not to split our Council at this stage. I for one am glad this is resolved, and we can move on with our normal business of supporting both our villages as we always have done. I feel the CGR has caused some angst between us and I am keen to assure everyone that despite some comments to the Council and especially on social media, in my experience over the last 7 years I have served on Worth Parish Council, I have seen zero evidence to indicate that either village is given preferential treatment, or either village loses out in any way whatsoever. I personally am a Copthorne Councillor, but I serve on Worth Parish to do my best for BOTH villages. I am happy to discuss the views of any resident that does not feel this is the case, and all the while I am Chairman, I will ensure this categorically is the case. I look forward to continuing to work in the best interests of Crawley Down as well as Copthorne.

All of us at Worth Parish Council are very disappointed that we have not progressed with getting the Youth Community Worker in place in September as we had hoped. Despite all our efforts this has not been possible due to a lack of candidates willing to take the role through Sussex Clubs for Young People, but please be assured that we are still progressing this issue as quickly as we can. We hope to have an interim arrangement up and running soon where at least we are offering a weekly Youth Club in both villages until we get a more permanent solution.

Plans for lighting up both our villages for Christmas are progressing well and I am excited to see the results of these efforts. Christmas will be here before we know it!

I wish you all a very pleasant Autumn and look forward to being able to bring you more news in the next edition where I am hopeful we would have progressed with some other initiatives currently being worked on.

CRAWLEY DOWN ENVIRONMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE WORKING PARTY

Local elections will be held in May 2023 and all residents are encouraged to consider whether they would like to put themselves forward to help plan and decide what is best for Crawley Down over the next four years. In the meantime, the Crawley Down Environment & Infrastructure Working Party dedicated to improving the quality of life in the Village is a good group to join to find out more about how the Council is involved in your daily activities. Contact the Clerk if you might be interested in joining this group.

The installation of an electricity supply to the Village Green has been approved. The cost of this, at several thousand pounds has been approved by the Council. The chosen location on the Village Green for the electrical cabinet requires some trenching of cables and the route for this is being evaluated to avoid disturbance to Tree Root Protection Zones.

As mentioned by the Council Chairman, the project to improve the provision of Youth Clubs for the Village has been delayed. In the meantime, please do make contact with the Clerk with ideas as to what is needed for your family and whether you would consider being involved.

Many of the roads and footpaths in and around the Village are in poor condition. An official inspection visit by West Sussex County Council was carried out in September. Many issues were identified; West Sussex County Council seem unable to deal with most of these in a realistic time-frame and so the Council is considering taking over some of the work itself. In particular, some improvements in the Village Centre to improve safety and access for disabled people.

The date for the Coronation of King Charles III has been announced. The Council is working with the Haven Centre and the CDRA to promote a similar event to the Jubilee Fair that was held last June. We would welcome input from residents on this particularly if they would consider volunteering to help.

NEWS FROM WORTH PARISH COUNCIL

Worth Parish Council's Community Emergency Plan has now been finalised. This plan provides support, advice and guidance to the local community (villages of Copthorne and Crawley Down) both in advance of and during any significant and/or local emergency.

Although not required by law, Parish Councils can play a vital role during and after a local incident. This Community Emergency Plan is designed to complement those of emergency responders (emergency services and Mid Sussex District Council).

By planning in advance, Worth Parish Council can help coordinate local response activities. By being prepared and being able to respond to an emergency can often help people recover more quickly and make communities more resilient.
