What is the Vision Document, and how will we use it?

The Vision document is an articulation of local informed initiatives and strategies providing Worth Parish Council with a prioritised agenda over the short/medium term to ensure resources are allocated and efforts focussed towards coordinated planning and execution consistent with residents' desires and requirements.

The contents of the document will:

- feed the annual budget planning process and setting of Council precept
- Inform staff appraisals and objective setting
- Prioritise the allocation and justification for the use of S106 & CIL (if applicable) to deliver local priorities
- Identify the need for additional funding opportunities

It is intended that the document will remain under constant review but will be formally released every two years providing a rolling agenda for WPC and its residents. The document will also provide a framework against which achievements of the Council can be reported in a fully transparent manner.

The Vision Document will be available on the WPC website as will any progress reports. Interim updates will be provided via the WPC social media platforms.


4-year roadmap for Worth Parish Council

Copthorne:

- Enhance CCTV provision (Pavilion, Prince Albert)
- Transport resolve Bakers Hill/Copthorne Bank/Shipley Bridge Lane/Elger Way junction issues
- Improve signage and identity of village [Welcome to 'pickets', Amenity signage, themed bins]
- Footpaths/roads/twittens/cycle paths improvements visible plan, active transport plan
- Rec playground execution
- Integration of Hawthorns/Heathy Wood developments
- Establish war memorial (Borers Arms/Copthorne Bank junction)
- Sports facilities (future of Acorns, coordinate and support evolving needs)
- To work with head teachers to support educational needs in the village and to ensure that s106 contributions are used to enhance local education
- To engage with developers to ensure any housing is of high quality and meets local needs.
- To ensure that the Copthorne Neighbourhood Plan is up to date and relevant to local and national Policy.
